### Letters and Information for Parents/Carers

The summer Public Examination Timetable will be published shortly and will be issued to all parents/carers of students in Years 10 (for selected students only), 11, 12 & 13. Where Year 10 students are involved in public examinations there will be a separate letter sent advising parents/carers of the details.

### Emergency Procedures in School

It is important that the School has up to date emergency contact information for all students. Please take time to check that we have the correct phone numbers to use in case of an emergency. Parents/carers can advise us of changes to emergency contact details using the SLG or by emailing [admin@st-maryshigh.herts.sch.uk](mailto:admin@st-maryshigh.herts.sch.uk)

#### a) Emergency Evacuation

An emergency evacuation will usually be practiced at least once each term to ensure that all personnel are clear about what to do if we need to leave the building quickly. For example, this might be required if there was a fire on site.

#### b) Lockdown Procedures

Lockdown procedures are used if there is an emergency situation where it is safer for personnel to remain inside the building. For example, if there was a gas leak in the local area. A two stage lock down procedure will be practiced on Monday 21<sup>st</sup> January during tutorial time. At this time, your child will have the lockdown procedure explained to them and all students and staff will talk and walk through the procedure. These drills are a normal part of our safety procedures and are not anything about which to be unduly concerned.

### Homework / Extended learning

Please note that staff continue to use Show My Homework to give tasks and resources to students so that they can complete tasks outside of lessons. Homework/Extended learning is an important part of work that students need to do and it is important that students try their best to complete tasks. There have been an increasing number of concerns raised recently by parents/carers about the amount of homework set, and investigation usually shows that the child has not listened/heard correctly that they needed to select tasks or work for a set amount of time on topics that they need to study to address gaps in their learning. Some students are trying to complete all of the work and are then becoming upset when it takes a very long time or they come across activities that are too hard.

If your child has worked for a sensible amount of time of a subject\* but has not completed their work, then please encourage them to see their teacher with the work done and to ask if they are doing the right thing. No child should be sitting up late into the night because homework is not completed.

\*For Yrs 7 – 9 this is between 30 – 60 minutes per homework subject. For KS4 this will be 60 – 90 minutes per subject and for KS5 at least 120 minutes per week per subject studied.

### Car Parking

Once again I ask for parent/carer cooperation with car parking on the school site, particularly at the start and end of the school day.

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This week, there have been issues with school coaches not being able to get into the car park to drop children back from trips offsite, coaches getting stuck in the driveway, cars being in areas that should not be used for parking, dangerous parking and most challenging of all, serious verbal abuse from parents/carers towards staff and other drivers. This is unacceptable and should never be evident, let alone in the presence of children and young people.

**Please make every effort to AVOID bringing a car on to the school site and ask your child to walk to a safe, nearby location in order to be picked up/dropped off by car. Parents/carers who fail to show respect in the way they use the school site, in their conduct towards staff or in the way they drive will have access to the school site limited/prohibited because this presents a danger to the safety and wellbeing of our community.**

#### School Uniform & Personal Presentation

Congratulations to the very large majority of students who are wearing their uniform and who look smart and business-like on the journey to and from school, as well as throughout the school day. A reminder that students are expected to:

- Be Ambassadors for St Mary's in their school uniform – looking good and being polite at all times
- Always wear school shoes as part of school uniform – trainers or boots are not allowed
- Wear a plain, dark school coat over the school blazer (and with a school jumper/cardigan/sweatshirt) when it is cold
- Always wear a lanyard with a Student Card when in school (the lanyard does not have to be worn outside of school)
- NEVER wear a hoody – even on the way to and from school. Hoodies will be confiscated and a detention issued
- Students should not wear false eyelashes, heavy makeup or coloured nail varnish or have nails that are beyond the end of finger tips so that they can be safe and avoid health and safety issues in school.

Students will be asked to remove any inappropriate or non school uniform items, which will be confiscated. Students may be asked to return home to correct their presentation and will need to make up lost time in detention.
