The Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award was set up in 1956 by Prince Philip the Duke of Edinburgh. Over 65 years later many young people still find achieving the DofE Award to be a fun adventure and a major challenge which is life-changing. Millions of young people in the UK and around the world have already taken part in the world's leading youth achievement award – pushing personal boundaries, gaining new skills and enhancing their CVs, College and University applications.

Last year, a number of Year 12 students in St Mary's Sixth Form decided to take part in the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme, participating in a successful journey of self-discovery and development. More importantly, this historical award is respected by employers, colleges and universities alike due to the qualities and skills students develop through their experience of participating as they cover each section of the Award.

During the course, the Year 12's had to self-manage themselves by participating in all 4 sub sections below for a least one hour per week:

- Volunteering undertaking service to individuals or the community.
- Physical improving in an area of sport, dance or fitness activities.
- Skills developing practical and social skills and personal interests.
- Expedition planning, training for and completion of an adventurous journey in the UK.

Each student did a minimum of 3 months' activity for each of the Volunteering and Skill sections and they were also asked to cover the physical section within six months. Some of the students showed their creative art skills by taking hours of artistic photos, whereas others expressed their physical side through music and dance. Some students even helped out Class 2 at Holy Trinity CE Primary School, developing the children's reading and writing skills. Most decided to take responsibility for a living organism for three months - they found out that it was more difficult than they actually thought!

Unfortunately, due to the Covid 19 crisis the Year 12 were unable to experience the Expedition section of the Duke of Edinburgh. However, the Organisation appreciated the difficulties that the students and Duke of Edinburgh Co-ordinators faced, and so they decided to give the students their Bronze Awards in the face of adversity.

Well done, and keep up the great work Year 12, next year you should try and achieve your silver Duke of Edinburgh award. When you see the following students around school, please congratulate them: Yaren, Rojin, Nazli, Richard, Ava, Salman, Ellie, Amelia, Aimee, William and Kalliah.

It has been very interesting learning about different forms of written communication and there has been the discovery of some new budding composers within the Year 7 Cohort. Students are enjoying using some Italian words and phrases to support their musical scores and to indicate dynamics, phrasing and tempo. 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Maths

It has been a busy few weeks for KS3 maths, with a number of Year 7, 8 and 9 students taking part in the UK Maths Challenge, and a team of Year 8 students taking part in the Hertfordshire Maths Challenge. Learners who wrote the UK Maths Challenge had one hour to complete a 25 question paper. The questions are designed to encourage problem-solving, creativity, and push learners beyond what they learn in the classroom.

In Year 8, three learners achieved bronze for the junior paper: Daniel, Filip and Hasin. In Year 9, Kamsi achieved silver for the Intermediate paper, which is a fantastic achievement on a paper which is also written by Year 10 and Year 11 students!

In addition to the UK maths challenge, Jimi, Aaryan, Bradley, Hasin and Jack took part in the Hertfordshire maths challenge. This was a team-based competition, with 29 schools competing, and was a mixture of standard maths problems, estimation, and a memory round. The learners took to the challenge with aplomb and worked together brilliantly: delegating tasks, discussing problems efficiently, and utilizing each other's strengths.

Any learners who missed out this year and would like to take part in future maths competitions should let their maths teacher know. These competitions are excellent enrichment opportunities for maths students looking to extend themselves.
