On the afternoon of last day of term, we held a service in our Memorial Garden in memory of Christopher Nicolaou, who passed away in March. It was attended by about 60 people, including staff, governors, and of course Christopher's family and friends. It was a touching tribute to Christopher and we presented his family with a tribute book containing messages from staff and students as well as photographs we had of Christopher taking part in different school events over the years.

We made Road Safety the focus of our act of worship this week. I share the Powerpoint that we showed students here: <u>AoW</u> and ask that you discuss with your children their behaviour on the way to/from school and how they can ensure they stay safe (including **not** using mobile phones or other devices to talk on or listen to music on). Sadly, half of all pedestrian deaths nationally are from people aged 15-19 and I ask that you look at the Powerpoint we shared with the students (including the notes at the bottom of many slides) and discuss this with your children. We want them to know how to behave safely when they are between home and school and to avoid situations that are dangerous to them and others.

English - Poetry

This year St Mary's was involved with the Just Talk poetry competition along with other local schools – the second year we have been involved. Just Talk is a multi-agency campaign, steered by young people. In 2017, a group of professionals from various agencies in Hertfordshire came together to discuss current mental health services, projects and campaigns and as a result of this meeting, extensive research and consultation took place with young people across Hertfordshire - The Just Talk campaign was born. They champion that 'We all have mental health, just like we all have physical health' and 'It's OK to not be OK'.

This year's competition was open to KS3, KS4 and Sixth Form students, with the title "The Gift of Kindness". Organised by Mrs Buxton, our Wellbeing Lead, in conjunction with the English department, the quality of the submissions was extremely high and proved difficult to judge.

To commemorate the Platinum Jubilee, our Year 7 artists paid homage to the Queen's 70-year service on the throne, by recreating images by artists over the last 70 years. Year 7 students created some incredibly creative and imaginative monoprints of her majesty, Queen Elizabeth II. Using ink and oil pastel mono printing techniques our Year 7 artists researched contemporary artists such as Andy Warhol, Banksy, Pure Evil and several more to inspire their designs.

Business Studies

Our amazing Year 9 and 10 Enterprise and Business students enjoyed researching businesses that have made changes to their products for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. They were interested to find out what brands were willing to do to help participate in the celebrations, whether it be to change their packaging to incorporate the event, add to their product ranges including some with limited editions, or amend their products name.

Students selected their favourites and then created imagined they were the marketing team for the business so they completed their own Marketing Mix '4P's' for the products to ensure that they would be marketed to the best ability during the Jubilee.

We are very impressed with their thought processes as their work shows they would be able to build effective marketing campaigns.

Product:

The Heinz salad cream bottle has had the packaging changed for the queen's jubilee. The changes in the packaging consist of a different background colour with a darker green than the original bottle packaging. The main difference is the wording 'salad queen' instead of salad cream. And it has a big crown with number 70 in the middle of it celebrating the queen's 70th year on the throne. Above the crown instead of it saying 'original' it says 'platinum jubilee edition'.

Price:

The original salad cream bottle costs £2.50. I would charge this exclusive salad queen limited edition jubilee bottle at £7 since it is limited edition and celebrating the queen's 70th which is a big deal in England so the packaging may be in high demand and will be very limited.



Place

I will sell this product in common English shops like Tesco, Iceland, Aldi, Waitrose, Lidl, Asda, Sainsbury, morrisons to celebrate the 70th year of the queen's reign in England. I will sell in these places because it's traditional English food shops.

Promotion:

Drama

KS3 explored the concept of what this phrase means – exploring the idea of what the advantages of being part of the royal family might be but also what the downside might be as well.


They groups used two contrasting tableaux, then movement and role play to bring their tableaux alive, before presenting their work to the class.

Words such as Service/Serving the people and duty were also explored.

Maths

Key stage 3 students in maths celebrated the queens Jubilee by looking at the kind of maths everyday people would have had to use during the early days of the Queen's reign. Students focused on using money prior to decimalisation and use of pounds, shillings, and pence. Once students had an idea of how this "unusual" currency system worked they explored the amount of maths required to buy items using 1950's prices and ended with planning a "coronation party"

Students enjoyed exploring this old currency, but overwhelming consensus was that they are glad it was replaced!

Science

Before half term Year 10 students were studying the Chemistry unit 'Material Choices.' During this we looked at different allotropes (forms) of carbon, including diamond. We studied the structure and bonding of diamond and this linked nicely to our KS4 Jubilee lesson on The Crown Jewels.

Students learnt about the history and composition of the Crown Jewels and also used their Scientific investigative skills and ideas about density to decide how they would determine if Crown Jewels on display at the Tower of London are the real deal or a false copy!

KS3 students also got involved by linking the Crown Jewels to their work on Atoms, Elements and Compounds (in Year 7) and Metals and their Uses (Year 8). These students used their knowledge to design their own crowns.

Did you know? The Crown Jewels comprise of over 23,000 gemstones.
