

Assistant Art Director/Junior Draughtsperson for Film and TV. Based in North London (near Elstree Studios). I specialise in draughting, conceptual art, model making and graphic props. I have worked on a wide range of Feature Films from Paramounts 'Mission Impossible Dead Reckoning - Part 1' to Prime Videos fun Christmas film franchise 'Your Christmas or mine?'.

Stephen Sheffield:

Stephen Sheffield has been teaching on various 3D design and making courses for the last 10 years and in Hertfordshire for the last 2. His background is as a modelmaker primarily for film & TV but also for the museum's & heritage sector. He has also taught in the field of Product Design but is most at home in a machine workshop where the really creative stuff is happening.

UEA Subject Taster Lectures Yr12. & Yr.13

insight4me Psychology – Psychopathology October 2nd

insight4me is a series of subject specific webinars for Year 12 & 13 students. The sessions directly support students' current studies by giving an insight into particular curriculum areas whilst affording an understanding of how these subjects continue beyond A-levels

University of East Anglia: Dr Jo Bower, Lecturer in Psychology, School of Psychology will present Sleep on it and feel better in the morning? The influence of sleep on our mental health. Have you ever wondered why things are harder to cope with if you've had a bad night's sleep? In this talk, we will consider how sleep changes our emotional responding, and look at how this may be important for the relationship between sleep and mental health.

Goldsmiths, University of London: Dr Lucy Oldfield, Senior Lecturer in Clinical Psychology, Department of Psychology will discuss Behavioural Experiments which are an important tool in Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT) (but also in other modalities) and have an evidence base showing they are the most effective part of treatment for OCD, other anxiety disorders and for working with depression.

insight4me Geography – Global Commons October 9th

University of Glasgow: Prof Chris Philo, Professor in the School of Geographical and Earth Sciences, will present **Tragedies of the Commons**. This talk introduces 'the commons' as meaning a complex bundle of resources, like air, water, land, etc. that people can supposedly access freely 'in common' with each other. We will ask about the historical roots of the commons, and of threats to it, in both the British countryside and British colonies. We will consider what is sometimes called 'the tragedy of the commons' — an idea with a curious double meaning — particularly emphasising what happens when different peoples in different places start to be denied access to common resources.

Biology: University Interactive Talk on Understanding & Tackling Cancer

Thursday 19th October

In this Biology session, Dr Helen James, will run an interactive talk for students on **Understanding & Tackling Cancer – What the Latest Research Tells Us.**

This interactive talk will cover the key molecular and cellular biology of cancer. We will discuss how the latest research is changing our understanding of the disease and how our increased knowledge is suggesting ways in which cancer may be diagnosed earlier and hopefully treated more successfully.

Some of the changes to genes involved in cell proliferation (mitosis), cell death (apoptosis), and the spread of tumours around the body (metastasis) will be discussed.
