In the latter term, students will study: **Circle theorems, Vector geometry and Equations of circles.** These topics cover the final areas of geometry yet to be covered. Students have already covered congruence and other equations in year 10, which will help with the understanding of these topics. A breakdown of topics they will study is:

- Use circle theorems to solve problems
- Add and subtract vectors
- Find scalar multiples of vectors
- Form vector expressions
- Form complex proofs using vectors
- Solve problems using equations of circles

In the first half term of Year 11, students study **The Human Body** – **staying alive.** It is imperative that students gain a good understanding of:

- Transport of substances
- Nervous system
- Hormones
- Homeostasis
- Hormones in reproduction
- Failure of organs and control systems

Questions students are expected to know and articulate are:

- How do substances get into, out of and around our bodies?
- How does the nervous system help us to respond to changes?
- How do hormones control responses in the human body?

Students have started Unit 1 Islamic Beliefs. During this term, students will complete Islamic Beliefs and Practices. Students will study:

- The six articles of faith in Sunni Islam and five roots of Usul ad-Din in Shi'a Islam, including key similarities and differences.
- The Oneness of God (Tawhid), Qur'an Surah 112.
- The nature of God: omnipotence, beneficence, mercy, fairness and justice (Adalat in Shi'a Islam), including different ideas about God's relationship with the world: immanence and transcendence.
- Angels, their nature and role, including Jibril and Mika'il.
- Predestination and human freedom and its relationship to the Day of Judgement.

• Why do we need to maintain a constant internal environment? In the second term, students move onto the topic of **Chemical analysis** and **Radioactive materials.** Students gain a knowledge in:

- Purity of substances
- Calculating the amount of substances in a reaction
- Measuring the amount of chemicals
- Radioactivity
- Using radioactive materials safely

Again, students use their knowledge to respond to questions such as:

- How are chemicals separated and tested for purity?
- How do chemists find the composition of unknown samples? (separate science only).
- What is radioactivity?
- How can radioactive materials be used safely?
- How can radioactive materials be used to provider energy? (separate science only)

• Life after death (Akhirah), human responsibility and accountability, resurrection, heaven and hell.

In the latter term students will continue with their study of Islam to build a knowledge on **Islamic beliefs and practices**. Students will be able to explain their answers with an awareness of how and why Muslims practice their faith. Students will learn about:

- The Five Pillars of Sunni Islam and the Ten Obligatory Acts of Shi'a Islam.
- Sawm: the role and significance of fasting during the month of Ramadan including origins, duties, benefits of fasting, the exceptions and their reasons, and the Night of Power, Qur'an 96:1-5.
- Zakah: the role and significance of giving alms including origins, how and why it is given, benefits of receipt, Khums in Shi'a Islam.
- Hajj: the role and significance of the pilgrimage to Makkah including origins, how hajj is performed, the actions pilgrims perform at sites including the Ka'aba at Makkah, Mina, Arafat, Muzdalifah and their significance.
- Jihad: different understandings of jihad: the meaning and significance of greater and lesser jihad; origins, influence and conditions for the declaration of lesser jihad.
- Festivals and commemorations and their importance for Muslims in Great Britain today, including the origins and meanings of Id-ul-Adha, Id-ul-Fitr, Ashura.

Students then move to **Theme B – Religion and Life**. In this unit students. Students consider the **Origins of the universe**, including:

- Religious teachings about the origins of the universe, and different interpretations of these
- The relationship between scientific views, such as the Big Bang theory, and religious views.
- The use and abuse of the environment, including the use of natural resources, pollution.

The use and abuse of animals, including:

- Animal experimentation/ vivisection
- The use of animals for food.
- The origins and value of human life

The **origins of life**, including:

- Religious teachings about the origins of human life, and different interpretations of these
- The relationship between scientific views, such as evolution, and religious views.
- Abortion, including situations when the mother's life is at risk.
- Euthanasia.

Students revisit beliefs **about death and an afterlife**, but with the focus on how beliefs impact how human life is valued.
