
The course will run during the period 2 October 2023 – 2 August 2024 and students can join anytime and can complete flexibly within this time.



Pathways to Banking and Finance: Years 12-13

Pathways to Banking and Finance is a financial access scheme which takes place across two years and supports Year 12 and 13 students who are interested in studying finance or a career in the financial sector.

Students join the scheme at the start of Year 12 and throughout the scheme they will be invited to attend a regular, engaging programme of activities including lectures, seminars, an insight day and university guidance sessions. Students will also have the opportunity to apply for an undergraduate mentor, a residential conference in the summer and for an insight programme at a financial firm.

The Pathways to Banking and Finance scheme is run collaboratively with the Sutton Trust and is supported by Deutsche Bank.

The scheme runs annually. Students take part in activities from the December of Year 12 through to March in Year 13.

The Pathways to Banking and Finance programme will be delivered using a hybrid model in 2023/24. Therefore, this will consist of a variety of both online sessions and in-person events, throughout the course of the programme. This ensures that students benefit from being able to visit our campus and have opportunities to interact with LSE staff and students, whilst maintaining the accessibility that online events provide.
