Exploring Law Conference: 25-28 March 2024

The Exploring Law Conference was founded forty-nine years ago to give Year 12 students who may be interested in studying Law at degree level a balanced view of the Law, both as an academic subject and as a profession, and also to offer an insight into life as a Cambridge undergraduate.

The Conference is run by a voluntary committee of seven current law undergraduates and relies on the invaluable support of the Law Faculty.

The 2024 Conference will be a four day in-person Conference. The committee are working hard to bring as many students as possible into Cambridge for a residential experience which will aim to offer students a taste of the study of Law. The conference will run between Monday 25 March and Thursday 28 March.

Who can apply

Any student in Year 12 can apply. You don't need to have any experience studying Law, or even to be sure that you want to apply for Law at university. They welcome applications from students of all backgrounds.

Fully funded places

Applications are encouraged from all backgrounds and all schools and we are keen that all year 12 students who wish to attend the Conference are able to do so. Although we are proud to offer all of our Conference places at a heavily subsidised rate, we also work closely with the Cambridge University Admissions Office and Widening Participation Partner Law Firms to offer further fully-funded places.

This year, 150 fully-funded places will be available to UK students from a state school background. Working with the Cambridge Admissions Office, we will assess all qualifying students on the basis of their need, prioritising students who:

- Are currently or have ever been in local authority care
- Are or have recently been eligible for Free School Meals
- Come from underrepresented backgrounds in higher education
- Would be the first in their generation to attend higher education
- Have experienced educational disruption

- Medical and dental specialities: paediatrics, prosthodontics, renal transplant, maxillofacial and many more!
- Q&A's each week with current medical and dental students.
- Support for the application process: UCAT, personal statements, and interviews.
- September Q&A with key admissions colleagues in the school of medicine at KCL, UCL, St George's, Queen Mary, and Imperial.
- A session on other careers in healthcare with six professionals currently working and teaching in the sector (nursing, dietetics, clinical science, etc.)

Lectures will be held on Wednesday evenings at 6-7.15pm. Their first lecture will be on Wednesday 14th February.

Widening Access to Medicine Taster Course & Virtual Work Experience, 9 – 12 April 2024.

Applications will be opening in December for the Widening Access to Medicine Taster Course & Virtual Work Experience taking place.



This is a free of charge 4-day Virtual Work Experience and Taster Course for Year 12 students, designed to increase the applicant's knowledge of the role of doctors and the training they undergo.

The taster course will provide opportunities to develop interpersonal skills, increase awareness of the undergraduate medical student experience and support students in their applications to study Medicine. This opportunity is for students who want to study Medicine at university and intend to apply through a widening access programme, or contextual admissions route. To qualify for this event students, need to be studying A Level Biology and one additional science, be under 18, and meet at least two eligibility

Subject Taster Lecture 22nd January Biology/Anaesthetics: Blood & Gas Exchange – Care Of The Patient During Surgery With Tom Shand From UEA

This session will give a broad introduction to the role of an Operating Department Practitioner and give some insight into how we keep patient's safe during surgery. During many surgeries patients will be under a general anaesthetic, rendering them unconscious. We will be giving a demonstration looking at how we breathe for patients under anaesthetic through pressure/ volume control, with a brief overview of the anatomy of the airway and gas exchange.

Following this we will be looking at blood and how surgery affects its composition. We will look at "blood gases", talking about haemoglobin levels and oxygen delivery. We will also look at the PH levels in blood during this scenario, how this may affect the patient and how we balance these to maintain homeostasis.

This session is aimed at students of biology to deepen their understanding of the subject and give real world examples of how their knowledge could benefit and even help save lives. Especially helpful for those looking into careers in healthcare.

Program Overview - Human Resources
