Before any other children are admitted, children with an Education, Health and Care plan naming St Mary's CE High School will be admitted. Rule 1 and 2 then will be considered. Children will then be admitted under the following ordered criteria:

1.	Children with an Education, Health and Care plan that names the School will be admitted	
1.	RULE 1: Looked After Children (LAC) and all previously looked after children, including those who	
	appear (to the Governing Body) to have been in state care outside England (IAPLAC) and ceased to be in	
	state care as a result of being adopted. The School uses HCCs published definition for this criterion, as	
2	set out in Note A at the end of this document.	
2	RULE 2: Children for whom it can be demonstrated that they have an exceptional medical or social	
	need to go to the school. Clear evidence+ must be provided which clearly demonstrates why St Mary's	
	CE High School is the only school that can meet the child's exceptional need. This evidence will be

4.	Children who have a sibling (brother or sister) in Years 7 to 12 at the School at the time of application.

	Note: The School will admit over PAN where to not do this would mean twins or multiple births could not be admitted together.	
5.	Regular worship at a Christian Church.

	denomination and whose attendance is verified by their minister. Regular worship means the child or at	
	least one of the child's parents attends public worship at least once a month and has attended for at

	Church or another Christian denomination which is a member of Churches Together in Britain & Ireland,	
	the Evangelical Alliance or Affinity.
